Subject name: Construction

General Statement of Intent

The Construction Workshop at Pebble Brook School (PBS) provides students with a practical skills based process aimed at achieving a Northern Council for Further Education – Entry Level 3 award in carpentry and bricklaying as well as an NCFE - Level 1 award in Plumbing. The modules include basic problem solving, identifying correct tools and materials for tasks, practical ability, communication, teamwork and personal performance review. They are intended to promote students understanding of the skills needed to utilise basic DIY tools and materials. The 'hands on' sessions are aimed at exploring and understudying actual capabilities versus perceived abilities. The classes help develop interpersonal and social skills by giving each student the ability to operate on an individual basis but within a team based framework. Our students have higher needs in terms of social and communication skills as well as independent living skills, so this workshop provides opportunities to practice these skills in order to become more confident, resilient and empathetic members of the community.

This workshop makes a huge contribution towards the PBS ethos of respecting individual differences, abilities, needs and beliefs and to appreciate that they are a member of a diverse community. It fully supports the development of the PBS skills curriculum as well as the Social, Interaction and Resilience (SIR) focus of our form time meetings.

There are strong links with many other aspect of the school curriculum, including Mathematics, English, Science, Physical Activity and PSHE.
